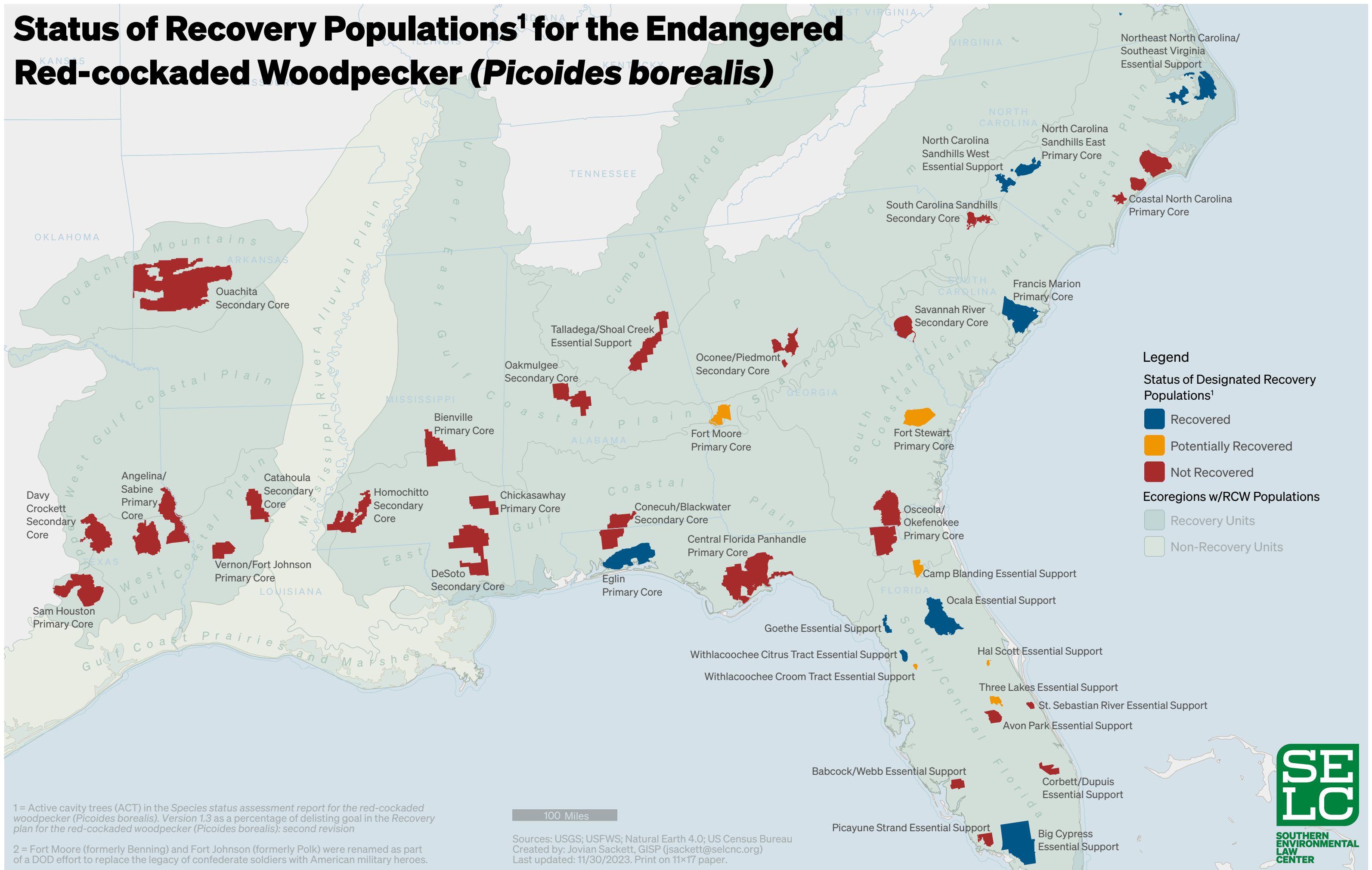


Status of Recovery Populations¹ for the Endangered Red-cockaded Woodpecker (*Picoides borealis*)
